knocks down the nose but there is fine freshness and richness to the suave and seductively textured bigger-bodied flavors that

are generously proportioned while displaying both good tension and complexity on the impressively persistent and more

powerful, if less refined, finish where a hint of wood appears. This isn't quite as mineral-driven but save for a subtle touch of warmth, it's beautifully balanced and should amply repay extended cellaring.
